EVENTS EXPLANATION:

- 5. THE 56 LB WT FOR HEIGHT: Also known as the weight over the bar. The event is thrown usually with one hand only (either hand) by grasping a metal block or ball weight to which a ring or rectangular handle has been attached by chain link and whose total weight does not exceed 56 pounds. The weight is swung between the legs or in any manner desired and thrown so that it will clear a bar over the head of the thrower which is arranged in pole vault fashion. Three attempts are allowed at each height. Each competitor may commence at any height he desires, but having begun, he must continue. All measurements should be made from the ground to the top of the bar at the point midway between the uprights.
- 6. SHEAF TOSS: A burlap sack of straw or hay (etc.) weighing sixteen pounds is thrown by pitchfork over a bar similar to a pole vault standard. Each competitor is allowed three throws at each height. Generally if the bar is touched the throw is considered a miss (however some Games allow any throw that clears the bar to count thus negating the need for a skillful judge to declare misses).

EXTRA THROWS: Many of the Games in Scotland allow the winner of each event to take up to three extra throws if he feels he has a chance to break the field record (an extra cash prize is awarded for all records set at a Games). Up to three throws are allowed and only the winner of that particular event is afforded the opportunity. This is an added treat for spectators as they are able to see some extra fine throwing and it gives the athlete a chance to reach his best possible effort.

RECORDS: Commencing with this issue, world records will be the best known records, usually those listed in the Scottish Games Association Handbook, Dalkieth, Scotland. American records will be the best known official (reported) efforts of Americans (U.S. & Canada), thrown in the U.S. or abroad. All-comer records are best efforts thrown in the U.S., regardless of the nationality of the athlete.

Of the novice athletes, Wayne Holtzclaw (Jacksonville, FL) was particularly outstanding in the Sheaf and 22# Hammer.

ATHOLL AND BREADALBANE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY HIGHLAND GATHERING: August 13, 1977 Victoria Park, Aberfeldy, Scotland

Following the morning Agricultural Show and the Parade of Competitors, the heavy events got underway. All throwing was done on an extremely well manicured cricket green. Bill Anderson, M.B.E. of Aberdeen won the champion-ship as usual and set five field and one world record in the process. He broke his own world best in the 28 lb wt set in 1966 (87' 2") with a sixth effort of 87' 7" (the winner of an event is often allowed three extra throws to break the record). Bill also tied Grant Anderson of Dundee with a world record equalling throw of 16 feet in the weight over the bar.

BALLATER HIGHLAND GAMES: Thursday, August 18, 1977 Ballater, Scotland

Ballater Games is one of the oldest of the famous Deeside Games. A crowd of about half the size of the previous year turned out to watch the heavies on an overcast and cold afternoon. No one seemed to be bothered by the weather except Fred Vaughan who had recently arrived in Scotland from the upper 90° of South Carolina and possibly Douglas Edwards, the second best Scottish athlete and Braemar champion of 1976, who had returned to Scotland the day before after spending a week at an International Highland Games in Jakarta, Indonesia. Nevertheless, it was a good competition as there was a three way tie for second place going into the final event. Bill Anderson was champion with Grant Anderson second and Cordon Forbes third.

THE 32ND FERGUS HIGHLAND GAMES: August 13, 1977 Fergus, Ontario By R. Short

The weather was beautiful, with the temperature in the middle seventies. About 22,000 spectators ringed the spacious oval field as a high quality competition began among about ten pipe bands and some very good dancers. The first athletic event was a Caber competition among the local media corps. They used a 12 foot X 20 lb. cardboard which was tossed for distance.

A tough tug-of-war competition took place among two police teams and three teams of farmers. The Toronto Folice won. The open Caber competition included: Dave Theriault, Canadian Champion, Ron Short, North Carolinian, two tossers from Texas, and some walk-ons. Short scored one twelve o'clock among his three turns of the 20 ft. Caber to win the event. Theriault turned it once out of three tries at 11:00.

The 32 pound Stone which weighed closer to 26 lbs. was won by Short with a throw of 31' 1/2". Second went to Theriault with 27'. The last Highland event was the 56 lb. Weight over the Bar. Short won at 12' 6" with the preferred one hand style, while Theriault again came in second with a two handed toss.

The last event was the famed Fergus Walk, in which the competitor lifts a 185 lb. weight (made from railroad ties) in each hand and walks as far as possible. The winning distance was 211 feet, far short of the 320 foot record but quite good for carrying 370 lbs. The winner, a local farmer, struggled with the burden as his wife ran beside him screaming encouragement. This seemed to annoy the stalwart lad but the crowd loved it and gave her a round of applause.

THIRD ANNUAL U.S. SCOTTISH HEAVY EVENTS AND CABER TOSS CHAMPIONSHIPS held at the CALEDONIAN CLUB OF SAN FRANCISCO'S 112TH ANNUAL GATHERING AND GAMES Santa Rosa, California, September 4, 5, 1977

Athletes from around the world were brought to Santa Rosa at the expense of the Caledonian Club and Ballantine Scotch Whiskey to compete for over \$3,000 in prize money, in one of the best publicized and most smoothly administered of all Scottish Games. The major attractions were Bill Anderson, Aberdeen, Scotland, who has been the Premier Scottish Athlete for the past ten years and holds world best marks in all events except the Stone and Shot Puts; Brian Oldfield, San Jose, California, holder of all Scottish and world best Stone Puts and world Shot Put record holder; Colin Mathieson, Boorowa, Australia, Australian Champion, British and Scottish Caber Champion; Fred Vaughan, N. Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, holder of three U.S. bests in the Heavy Events, Keith Tice, Clovis, California, best American Hammer Thrower; John Ross, Santa Rosa, California, Northern California Champion; Dave Theriault, Fergus, Ontario, Canadian Caber Champion and Gordon Vernadoe, Grandfather Mountain Caber Champion. The Amateur Division was partially composed of Dick Shelton, Santa Clara, California, and Dave McKenzie, Sacramento, California, both A.A.U. Hammer Throwers.

An outstanding crowd of some 26,000 people enjoyed the sometimes very hot weather over the two days of competition (five events including 56 For Ht and Caber each day). As usual, Bill Anderson was in control of the competition winning seven events and setting four field records. Brian Oldfield edged out Keith Tice for second while winning three events and setting three records; one, the 56 For Ht - a U.S best. Tice placed consistently both days to achieve his third place finish.

In the Amateur Division, Shelton and McKenzie had a very close competition with Shelton emerging on top.

Ed McComas (Baltimore, MD) broke two meet records, won six Firsts and the Championship. Pete Hoyt (Altamonte Springs, FL) set a meet record in the Sheaf and placed second overall. David Bryson, Albemarle, NC was third overall. In addition, several local competitors fared very well; Jim Pauli, a weightlifter and track athlete placed fourth and Joel Keefer, who has competed here for many years placed fifth.

These Games are held at Middleton Place Plantation each year and are one of the most popular among the athletes. This year was no exception as all the regulars showed up, some for their first Games since July. It was very hot (100°F) but the competition was close all day and as usual the final event determined the winner. In addition to the regulars, Richard Borden and Tom Johnson of Mt. Pleasant, SC and the Medical School of SC, did very well in their annual attempt at the Games.

Fred Vaughan edged Ed McComas by one point for the Championship while setting two field records and tieing a third. Ron Short placed third overall while setting a record in the Sheaf. Fourth place went to Tom Johnson, fifth to Richard Borden and sixth to Arnold Pope.

In addition to the reenactment of the Revolutionary War battle which took place near here, for the first time since its inception, three years ago, heavy events were included in the program. The field was composed of Fred Vaughan, Peter Hoyt and Ron Short on Saturday and a further exhibition was provided by Arnold Pope on Sunday. Due to a pulled muscle, Short was unable to enter all events.

The grounds at which these Games are held are extensive and the location (30 miles south of Fayetteville) in the center of some of the earliest Scottish settlements in America should provide for one of the best Games in the South in the future.

All winning throws are field records and the weights were the Charleston implements.

Stone Mountain Park once more was the setting for a close competition and although only two field records were broken, several personal bests for the year were achieved by the competitors. Some of the athletes in attendance were Brian Oldfield, San Jose, CA, 1972 Olympian and 2nd to Bill Anderson in the U.S. Heavy Events Championship (Santa Rosa, CA, 1977); Ed McComas, Baltimore, MD, U.S. Heptathlon Champion 1977 (Alexandria, VA); Fred Vaughan, N. Myrtle Beach, SC, Grandfather Mountain Games Champion, 1977; Ron Short, Winston-Salem, NC and Bob Porterfield, Charlotte NC, champions of Stone Mountain and Grandfather

Mountain Games; Gordon Varnedoe, Oakland, CA, 1977 winner of G.F.M.G. Caber Toss, Errol Linden, Atlanta, GA coach and former Atlanta Falcon and Michael Reid of Monkton, MD.
