The North American Scottish Games Association is dedicated to the promotion and understanding of Scottish Heavy Events competition and the furthering of the sport.

EVENTS EXPLANATION

1. The 56 lb. and 28 lb. Weight Throws: The weight is metal with a spherical or block head attached by chain to a ring or triangular handle, is not more than 18" in overall length, and has a gross weight of 56 or 28 pounds (a 1/2 and 1/4 hundredweight, respectively). The weight is thrown with one hand only from a nine foot approach behind a straight trig or toe board 4'6" by 6" high. Each competitor is allowed three throws - the best to count. A foul is called and the thrower loses that turn if any part of his body touches the trig (except the face nearest the competitor when he takes his stance) or the ground beyond the trig. Each throw shall be measured from the point on the trig nearest where the athlete's leading foot is placed (left foot on a right handed thrower) to the break of ground made by the head of the weight.

The First Annual Orlando Games was sponsored by the newly formed Scottish American Society of Central Florida, Inc., P. O. Box 6112C, Orlando, Florida 32853. General Chairman, Sharon K. Bottomley.

Besides eight regular heavy events there was pipe band and dancing competition.

In spite of the absence of some of the regular heavies due to the snow in the North, many experienced athletes turned out for the first competition of the year. Fred Vaughan, North Myrtle Beach, SC, won six events and the overall championship followed by Ron Short, Winston Salem, NC who had two wins (one of which was an excellent 23'2" SHEAF TOSS). This Games marked the return of George MacAulay who was a regular competitor prior to his Air Force assignment to Korea. George finished third overall. Pete Hoyt did an excellent job in organizing and running the heavy events as well as finishing fourth in the standings. Chauncey Wallace, West Palm Beach, Florida placed fifth.

2. Dunedin Scottish Games: March 18, 1978, Dunedin High School Stadium, Dunedin, Florida. Chief Steward and Athletic Chairman - Dr. Norman Ross.

The twelfth edition of these games took place over a three day period with the heavy events beginning at 1:00 P.M. Saturday, following the amateur competition in the morning.

The highlight of the athletics was the CABER TOSS as it was the sixth event and it was apparent the championship would be won or lost in this event. The log was about 19' 6" and weighed near 100 lbs. A rejuvenated Arnold Pope gave the impression it would be easy with an opening throw of 1:30. This was followed by four "no throws" until McComas hit 9:30. Pope's second effort was 12:30, Vaughan got a 1:30 and McComas had an 11:00. On his third try Arnold turned it to 10:30 and everyone else failed except big Ed who edged Arnold out of first in the event with a last try of 11:45.

Ed McComas, Baltimore, MD, added to this win with firsts in the STONE and SHEAF, followed by second in the four other events to give him the championship with 34 pts. Fred Vaughan had four wins and placed second with 31 pts. George MacAulay from the Bahamas was third, Peter Hoyt, Altamonte Springs, FL, fourth, Arnold Pope, Fayetteville, NC, fifth and Michael Reid, Monkton, MD, sixth.

New field records were established in the 22lb. HAMMER by Vaughan (84' 1 1/2") and in the 20# STONE by McComas (41' 7").

7. Savannah Scottish Games: May 6, 1978 (Held the first Saturday in May) Attendance - 3500.

The Savannah St. Andrews Society (founded 1773) sponsored its first Games ever at restored Fort Jackson, three miles East of the city on the Savannah River. The Fort was built between 1809-1840 and was Robert E. Lee's first command.

Pipe Band and Dancing competition from throughout the South were on hand in addition to eight experienced heavies. The championship of the seven athletic events was won by Fred Vaughan (N. Myrtle Beach, SC) with 34 pts; followed by Ron Short (Winston-Salem, NC) 28 pts; Ed McComas (Baltimore, MD) 27 pts; Michael Reid (Monkton, MD) 12 pts; Arnold Pope (Fayetteville, NC) 9 pts; Gordon Varnedoe (Oakland, CA) and Terry Hayes (Dunedin, FL) with 1 pt each.

A sunny day with a good breeze from the river together with a good grass throwing surface contributed to several personal records and near P.R.'s. Most notable was Michael Reid who achieved P.R.'s in three events (STONE, HAMMER, 28# WT) and Ron Short who threw a P.R. in the HAMMER.

Vaughan's three-firsts and four-seconds were highlighted by a near best of 87' 3 1/4" in the HEAVY HAMMER which edged McComas by 2 3/4". McComas listed two-firsts, one-second, three-thirds and derived a measure of revenge by knocking Vaughan off in the 28# WT. Short was steady and strong as he managed two-wins, two-seconds, two-thirds and a fourth for Second Place overall. His most significant win was the CABER in which he was the only thrower to turn the monster log (18' X 130 lbs).

David C. Barrow, III did an excellent job as Athletic Chairman as did Gordon Varnedoe who promoted this First Games in his home town. The announcing of Bob Bahr (Atlanta, GA) who also helps at the Stone Mountain Games was very effective.

8. Colonial Highland Gathering: The 16th Delaware Highland Heptathlon, June 3, 1978, Fair Hill, MD. Attendance - 12,000. Sponsored by the Scottish Games Association of Delaware, Newark, Delaware. Jimmy Flynn, Athletic Steward and Gary Patterson, Field Judge.

Ed McComas of Baltimore put on a stellar performance to win or tie for the championship for the fifth consecutive year, achieving a personal

best in the 28# (71' 8 1/2") and an outstanding STONE TOSS (47' 9") for two of his three first places coupled with two seconds, a tie for second and a third. This was a fine win for Ed, who has been hindered somewhat by a knee injury, giving him his second major championship of the year.

Ron Short, Winston-Salem, NC, achieved his best overall performance in over a year to take second place in the heptathlon. Ron had wins in the CABER and SHEAF as well as two seconds, a tie for second and a third. Fred Vaughan, North Myrtle Beach, SC, managed third overall with two wins, field records in the 56# WT FOR DISTANCE (34' 1 1/4") and the 56# WT FOR HEIGHT (14' 3"). Michael Reid, Monkton, MD, placed fourth with a couple of personal records while Arnold Pope of Fayetteville, NC and Pete Hoyt of Altamonte Springs, FL, rounded out the field.

Jimmy Flynn did an outstanding job organizing and running the heptathlon for the seventh year in a row, especially considering that he was coaching his University of Delaware track team to a championship season at the same time.
